- 8. Electric guitar
- 9. Plectrum / pick

Bass answers

- 1. 4
- 2. Bass plays lower notes and a guitar plays higher notes
- 3. Upright bass is bigger and the electric bass has been designed to be a portable version
- 4. Slapping the strings, picking individual strings, chords

Piano answers

- 1. Upright piano, grand piano
- 2. Electric keyboard, organ,
- 3. They are hit by a hammer connected to the keys
- 4. Boogie Woogie, Jazz, Classical, Pop
- 5. 10 (because you have 10 fingers that can each press a key)

Drums answers

- 1. Cymbals
- 2. Hit, choked,
- 3. Hihat, bass drum
- 4. Toms, snare, bass drum
- 5. 4 (because we have 4 limbs that can be used to play: right hand, left hand, right foot, left foot)
